Transportation & Economic Corridors 2026 Partnering Award Application

Background

The Transportation and Economic Corridors Partnering Award is an annual recognition program of completed contracts that best promotes, adheres to, and optimizes the principles of partnering. The main focus is to celebrate success, share lessons learnt, and honour all parties' participation in the partnering process.

Eligibility

- All Alberta Transportation and Economic Corridors contracts, where Alberta
 Transportation is the owner and awarded the construction contract to a
 contractor, with a consultant being the representative for Alberta Transportation
 and Economic Corridors in managing the contract, are eligible to apply.
 AND
- 2. All construction projects completed within the 2025 calendar year are eligible to apply.
- Contracts between Highway Maintenance Contactor and Transportation and Economic Corridors are eligible to submit an application. This category will not require a consultant to be involved. Maintenance will be judged as a separate category. AND
- 4. A particular project may only apply once.

Criteria and Instructions

- 1. All application forms must be jointly completed and signed by all parties.
- 2. A group of judges, representing each of the three parties, will be reviewing the applications.
- 3. Projects will be separated into categories based on the projects work type.
- 4. All applications shall complete the Questions in all Sections.
- 5. The application in each category receiving the highest score will be award the 2026 Partnering Award and prize.
- 6. Scores will be assessed by the judges with the following in mind: establishment, measurement and achievement of project goal; value expectation improved by Partnering; issue resolution and team based problem solving; project completion on time on budget; management of relationships; lessons learnt.
- 7. All applications shall be submitted by Jan 15, 2026.

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- 8. The winners will be announced at the 2026 CEA Transportation Conference, along with the 2026 Minister's Awards for Transportation Innovation.

- 10. The applicant may remove any proprietary information (etc. pricing) from any required supplemental information before submitting.
- 11. The judges may contact the applicants to obtain more information or seek clarification.
- 12. Highway Maintenance Operation submissions will not have to complete the application in its entirety. Items like a consultant may not be present for a maintenance contract, or the score card will pertain to maintenance contracts.

- 4. How effective is the application of the issue resolution ladder on this project?
- 5. Please provide an example of a challenge on the project and how it was resolved through the application of principles of Partnering.
- 6. Identify any innovative ideas that evolved through the project Partnering process.
- 7. How did Partnering improve relationships between the Alberta Transportation, the Consultant and the Contractor during and after the project?
- 8. How did Partnering allow the project team to improve the project's benefit (time, quality, cost, etc.) beyond what was specified in the Contract?
- 9. Any suggestions on how Partnering on Alberta Transportation projects can be improved?
- 10. Please describe why this particular project should receive the Partnering Award?

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
